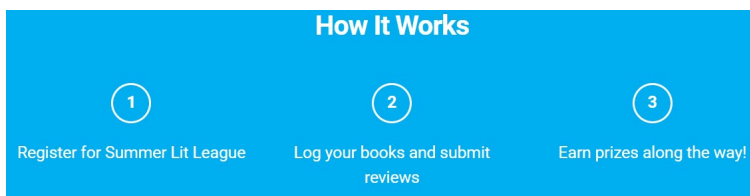

Summer Lit League Program

Puppets are the stars of Cleveland Public Library's 2019 Summer Lit League program, which runs June 3 through July 26.

With a theme of "PuppetPalooza" and a full lineup of events, community celebrations, hands-on learning experiences, and giveaways, Cleveland Public Library's 2019 Summer Lit League program is poised to be bigger and better than ever. Young readers are encouraged to register now for this summer reading program, which begins June 3 and culminates at the CPL150 Street Festival on July 27.



“At Cleveland Public Library, we strive to foster a love of reading among the young people in our city,” says Felton Thomas, Jr., Executive Director and CEO. “This year, to celebrate our 150th anniversary, our Summer Lit League programming will go above and beyond anything we’ve done before. From puppetry workshops to author



appearances, neighborhood celebrations, and an impressive selection of giveaways, we're ready to help kids and teens get excited about reading this summer."

Summer Lit League is open to children from birth through age 18. Participants are separated into three age groups: Early Learners (0-4), Kids (5-11), and Teens (12-18). Early Learners and Kids must read at least ten books to complete Lit League, and Teens must read at least three. The "PuppetPalooza" theme is not only a nod to the Library's The World of Puppets exhibit, but will also be integrated into weekly youth workshops held at all branches. Workshops will focus on making puppets, storytelling through puppetry, building puppet stages, and more, and will conclude with puppet performances created, led, and performed entirely by participants.

"Reading over the summer helps kids and teens build vocabulary, stay engaged, and show up to the new school year better prepared," says Erica Marks, Youth Outreach and Programming Coordinator. "Lit League provides the chance to get involved in your community and be creative throughout the summer months—and to win awesome prizes just for reading."

Readers who successfully complete Lit League and attend the CPL150 Street Festival will have the chance to win prizes that may include, depending on the age group: tickets to see The Lion King at Playhouse Square, a Nintendo Switch game system, a Kindle

Fire, an Apple iPad, Beats headphones, tickets to the Children's Museum of Cleveland, Chipotle coupons, backpacks full of school supplies, and more.

All Lit League programs are free and open to the public.
